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# Spring Meeting April 25 at Skyline Middle School

The Spring V<sup>2</sup>CTM Conference will be held on Wednesday, April 25, 2018, at Skyline Middle School in Harrisonburg. The meeting will feature a keynote

**Sherry Parrish** is a native of Birmingham, Alabama and began her career in education in 1979. A former Assistant Professor at The University of Alabama at Birmingham and classroom educator, Sherry currently serves as a mathematics education consultant. Sherry holds a doctorate in Educational Leadership from Samford University and is a recipient of the 1997 Presidential Award for Excellence in Mathematics Teaching. She is the author of *Number Talks: Helping Children Build Mental Math and Computation Strategies*, which received the AEP Distinguished Achievement award, and *Number Talks: Fractions, Decimals, and Percentages*.

### John Stevens to Receive Award for Excellence in Math Education

Each year, V<sup>2</sup>CTM recognizes a classroom teacher on the elementary, middle, secondary, university, or math specialist/coach level for his/her outstanding work by conferring the H. Joseph Hill Award for Excellence in Mathematics Education. At the April 25 V<sup>2</sup>CTM conference, the 2018 award will be presented to John Stevens, a Geometry and AP Calculus teacher at Turner Ashby High School in Rockingham County. John has been teaching for seven years and participates regularly in professional development opportunities. He has presented at local conferences, and he co-published an article for *Mathematics Teacher* that was highlighted by the journal in a NCTM-sponsored Twitter chat. He volunteers his time at many school and V<sup>2</sup>CTM events, including serving as emcee for the regional 24-Challenge tournament. John's dedication to exemplary teaching and quest for continual improvement and development have distinguished him among his field. He strives to teach conceptually and to make connections among math topics explicit for his students. With this goal in mind, he recently re-structured his courses, beginning with a comprehensive look at the big ideas in each of his subjects. He has adopted a standards-based grading system that promotes mastery learning and a growth mindset.
