When John was 10 years old, he walked down the hallways of Stuarts Draft Middle School to find his locker and classes on what he believed was a normal "back-to-school" night. However, the moment he walked through the door frame of Room 30, he met his sixth-grade science teacher, NS. Cross. From that moment on, he knew he wanted to be a teacher - not just any teacher, but a teacher as influential as Ms. Cross. That moment in Room 30 where he met Ms. Cross still fuels his drive as a teacher. Yet, his single

greatest accomplishment, if asked, is his family. If you have ever worked with John via Zoom, WebEx, Google Meets, or Teams, you have almost certainly met each member of his immediate family through their impromptu cameo appearances. John lives in Waynesboro, Virginia with his wife Danielle, a fellow educator, their two children, Tessa and Jackson, and Labrador retrievers, Bella, Dukes, and Ollie. SOL Practice Items

Updated SOL Practice Items are available for Grades 3-8 and End-of-Course Mathematics tests. These practice items will provide students an opportunity to become familiar with the types of test questions that will be administered to assess the 2023 Mathematics Standards of Learning in spring 2025. These practice item sets include new item types that will be field-tested in spring 2025. Field test items are used to collect data and do not count towards a student's overall test score. Revised resource documents, <u>Guided Practice Suggestions</u>, accompany the updated mathematics practice items to provide specific guidance for teachers or other adults in leading students through the questions.



Math Textbooks and Instructional Materials

At its February 2025 meeting, the Virginia Board of Education approved a list of mathematics textbooks and instructional materials. All documents related to approved textbooks and instructional materials can <u>be found here</u>. Additionally, the Virginia Board of Education will receive for initial review an additional list of recommended Kindergarten - Grade 12 Mathematics Textbooks and Instructional Materials. The list of recommended materials is available for a 30-day public review and comment period. All stakeholders may provide feedback using the link below or by emailing vdoe.mathematics@doe.virginia.gov. It is anticipated that the Board of Education will take final action on the additional list of recommended Kindergarten - Grade 12 Mathematics Textbooks and Instructional Materials at its March 2025 meeting.

Chris Willingham (willinjc@jmu.edu) is an associate professor in the mathematics department at James Madison University. At JMU he teaches mathematics content courses for preservice teachers and conducts research in teachers' beliefs and attitudes about mathematics and the teaching and learning of mathematics. He holds undergraduate engineering degrees and a master's in mathematics education from Vanderbilt University, as well as a Ph.D. in Interdisciplinary Mathematics and Science Education from Middle Tennessee State University.



In his early career, Dr. Willingham worked professionally in healthcare, engineering, and construction management before teaching in highschool mathematics and science classrooms in West Tennessee. During his doctoral studies, he transitioned to mathematics teacher education and professional development, which remain his primary interests today. In addition to his teaching and research roles at JMU, he has just completed an editorship with NCTM's Mathematics Teacher: Learning and Teaching and a longitudinal professional development program for K-8 mathematics teachers. He is always looking for more collaborative, high-leverage opportunities in these areas.
